

Post-Pandemic Healing and the Ocean:

The sea breeze rebalances the serotonin levels that cause feelings of happiness "The ocean can not only heal cuts with salt, but it has the ability to trigger a psychological state of calm and contentment. It can literally wash away the pain."

and wellness. Moments of meditative tranquility by the beach encourage introspection to regain calm. The infinite horizon allows access to a state of well-being reinforced by the intensity of the reverberated light. The coastline thus restores the ability to let go and welcome serenity, an imperative facing with increasing levels of stress.

Time by the ocean leaves you feeling awakened and cleansed – physically, emotionally and spiritually. The combination of sun, sea and sand is the most natural and easily accessible form of therapy available to us as human beings. Our affinity for water is even reflected in the near-universal attraction to the color blue.



Marketing research has found that people tend to associate blue with qualities such as calmness, openness, depth and wisdom. With the human body made up of around 70% water, it seems that we do in fact belong to the sea!

The health benefits of the ocean are indeed very real. We have been aware of them long before science came in with the proof. In modern society, time near the ocean is becoming even more important than ever before. The benefits of sea water offer a valuable way to offset the stresses of living and working in modern contexts. These huge bodies of saltwater are literally brimming with mysterious and wonderful ways to nourish and nurture body, mind and spirit.

The Burlington Community Club/Park Society (BCPS) and the Harbourville Restoration Society (HRS) are working together on a joint project funded by the New

Many activities for the North Mountain community are being planned, including workshops, the development of the Burlington park and a special oral history initiative. Community members of all ages will be invited to participate in a public education campaign to make banners promoting community life and the protection of our land and sea. Our New Horizons for Seniors Program focuses on engaging seniors as community leaders to share their expertise and to engage folks of all ages to

build a welcoming, active community. Our project will run from April until November 2022.

The Harbourville Restoration Society will take the lead with the workshops, film showings, the oral history initiative and the public education campaign. The overall theme for these events and workshop is the enjoyment, care and protection of the North Mountain environment: land, sea and people. Many of these presentations will draw on the expertise of local people who have many years of experience living and working in this area. The list of the topics is provided on our website at www.harbourville.ca under Community Project: Upcoming Workshops - the dates and topics are still being confirmed so please check back regularly for the latest updates. All of the workshops and presentations are free. However, spaces are limited so we ask people to please reserve their spot. For those who want to attend a workshop at the Hall, you are most welcome, with the understanding that COVID-19 protocols, as laid out by the Nova Scotia government, will be carefully followed. The Burlington Community Park Society will focus on developing a community park that will enhance active, healthy living in our North Mountain Community. The park development projects will include: building short, accessible trails; a bridge; a pollinator garden; some recreation facilities and/or fitness stations. In 2020 we started with a five year plan to develop this community space. This year with the funding from the New Horizons for Seniors Program and the Platinum Jubilee Project we will further develop our park that is meant to be enjoyed by the community for years to come!

"On behalf of the Minister of Canadian Heritage, \$5,000 has been awarded to the Burlington Community Club to organize activities, under the Celebration and Commemoration Program."

The Burlington Community Park Society will use the opportunity to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee as we start the next phase of the park expansion as per the plan drafted with Cobequid Consulting. Our community thrives on outdoor experiences, and historical

preservation. We plan to:

- prepare the park field with a historic horse and plough in preparation for wildflower gardens and native flora, and possibly creation of a medicinal garden
- establish saplings to regenerate the Acadian forest. Example: Sugar maple, Yellow Birch, along the south property line.
- host community events for planting saplings and to celebrate the 2022 Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II
- create a signage program and interpretative panels to complement these initiatives

On April 10 the BCPS hosted a community consultation walk and talk session at the Burlington Community Park. The committee hosted 15+ local residents and visitors to explore the up-and-coming park development as well as to brainstorm other ideas which could be integrated into the park development in later phases. 
